- Jess looking into if we have May 1 for parents as a last day or if we have to hit the print button by the morning
- April 30 we will need to cross reference hard copy orders vs google form orders
- minimum order is 50 books
- PAC will pay and then collect money from parents
- If we need to ask for an extension we can (we have lots before)

Yearbook 2023/2024

- Lifetouch link to order through their system has already been generated
- Plan will be to let parents know they can order the 2023/2024 yearbook once the 2022/2023 yearbooks are out and delivered (so there is no confusion between yearbooks), mid to end of June
- Hopefully we can get teachers to review their pages before the end of the school year so that the current teacher is reviewing their current students (the ultimate goal)
- Link will be open throughout the summer and a couple weeks into September so that parents have a good amount of time, order in Sept and delivery in Oct

Yearbooks in the future

- if we continue with liketouch, the process should look like this:
- after school photos, sent portraits to lifetouch to upload into the system (Oct-Nov)
- yearbook theme to be picked, principles address and grade 8 memories request (can be done with a lifetouch rep)
- Dec-April compiling candids
- April-June final candids and grade 8 farwell
- Mid June PAC to approve, send link to parents to order (open to mid Sept)
- End of June Teachers to approve names and candids
- Mid Sept press print, delivery end of Oct
